HGP launches biggest bid round programme

The Heritage Lottery Fund has launched its biggest bid round programme yet, inviting applications for funding to support heritage projects across the country. The programme is open to all heritage organisations and individuals, and offers funding of up to £100,000 per project.

The South East of England has received over £1 billion from the National Lottery so far. This transfers as £146 per head of the population, 6% more than the UK average.

There is less money available for new projects so applicants will face tougher competition than ever before. Fund-seekers need to ensure they can supplement their Lottery grant with money from other sources such as Europe; partnership working is becoming an increasingly important part of every Lottery bid.

As well as providing an opportunity to learn about constructing partnership bids and accessing European funds, the South East Conference will be a rare opportunity for a cross-distributor approach to the Lottery, allowing people to catch up on the latest policy and programme developments and problem-solve with distributors, consultants or peers. It will be an ideal platform to share best practice, create new contacts and learn from previously successful projects and will offer valuable insider advice on putting together a winning bid.
