Early this year Tessa Jowell flagged up her concern about a range of issues and continuing problems in the Lottery funding process. In March she launched a formal review – making clear that there would be no no-go areas for scrutiny. She even questioned whether the Lottery distributors were the best vehicles for getting the money out to where it should go.

The next few months will prove vital in the future of the National Lottery as a funding source. Details of the review will be out for consultation and debates at all levels will no doubt ensue.

The Lottery Monitor North East Regional Conference will be an opportunity to discuss the Lottery Review with those involved in all aspects of Lottery funding from the north east region; Representatives from the Distribution Boards, ONE North East, the North East Regional Assembly, VONNE and a number of other groups including previous award winners.

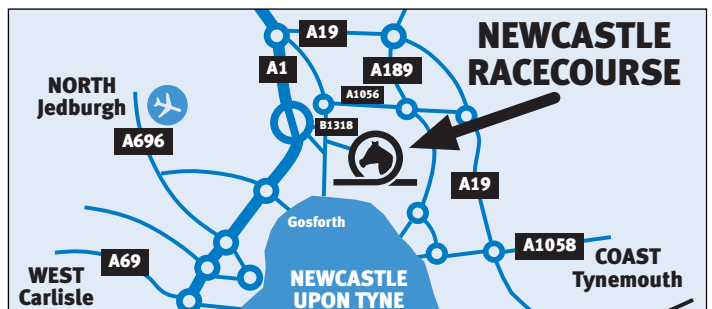
